University Advancement and Marketing has taken the lead to facilitate the conducting of an Electronic Information and Technology Accessibility Audit and Planning initiative that focuses on auditing all University EIT systems, providing a correction action plan, and developing an EIT Accessibility Policy and Procedures for the University.



Several resources have been identified for food insecure students.




The University continues to sponsor an impressive list of culturally-related programming.

Serving Them



The Veteran Resource Center at Ferris State University is run by veterans for veterans. The University earned the Michigan Veterans Affairs Agency's gold-level rating for veteran friendly programs.



Governmental Relations and General Counsel provided in excess of 75 campus training sessions on anti-harassment, non-discrimination, respect in the workplace, equal employment opportunity, and affirmative action, to approximately 790 University attendees.

Diversifying the Student Body



The number of students who identify as one of the racial and ethnic groups that we count increased by 1,310 from 2007 to 2015. However, there was a significant decrease in Fall 2016, see Appendix E of annual report.


We must remain vigilant.

In Spring 2015 the Diversity and Inclusion Office hosted a celebration to acknowledge that the University had enrolled more than 500 International students. But, by Fall 2016 the enrollment of International students had dropped to 396. See Appendix E.

Ferris has had International students since the 1890s.

There are about 200 countries in the world. Our challenges include deciding which countries to target and, equally important, how to make the University community welcoming to the students who come from other countries. This work has begun.

How big are the gaps?

 Strengthen the academic resources in the Office of Multicultural Student Services (OMSS) and foster a stronger collaboration between OMSS, colleges, and faculty to create intentional learning opportunities for students.

Diversifying the Workforce



Dr. Arrick Jackson, Dean College of Education and Human Services

Hiring a diverse workforce is one of the most persistent diversity challenges for the University, with Ferris ranking 13th of the 15 public 4-year institutions in the state. It is noteworthy that several women and African Americans were recently hired in leadership positions. These hires were made in Academic Affairs and Administration and Finance. According to the diversity audit, roughly 30 percent of white faculty did not believe that hiring a diverse faculty should be a priority for the institution. This is significant because faculty have the primary responsibility for hiring faculty.



Regarding diversifying the workforce, the most effective results have occurred when senior leadership championed the importance of having a diverse workforce.

Have divisions, in cooperation with the Diversity and Inclusion Office, develop plans for increasing the diversity of the workforce.




Challenges

A Multicultural Student Advisory Group was established to provide informal counsel to the Vice President of Diversity and Inclusion and the Vice President of Student Affairs on various issues affecting the undergraduate experience. This group acts as a sounding board, provides constructive feedback, and identifies issues needing attention.
