Diversity Climate Survey

Cross tabulations of demographic variables and factor 1 (prior experience with race/ethnicity)

Of the 144 scaled questions, 23 factors were generated. Below are figures of cross tabulations of some demographic variables within factor 1: Experience with diversity prior to attending Ferris State University regarding race/ethnicity. For each cross tabulation, a table with a number of subjects that completed the survey is given. A figure for each cross tabulation is generated using response percentages within a given variable rather than the number of subjects.

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Factor 1: Experience with Diversity Prior to FSU Regarding Race/Ethnicity consisted of 3 scales

- Question 20: Prior to entering this college/university, what percentage of your close friends was similar to you regarding race/ethnicity.

- Question 25: Prior to entering this college/university, what percentage of your community you resided in was similar to you regarding race/ethnicity.

- Question 30: Prior to entering this college/university, what percentage of the people in your school or work environment was similar to you regarding race/ethnicity.




Figure 1: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within class standing shows that across all class standings (except non-degree students), between 39%-44% of FSU students indicated that prior to attending FSU, almost everyone in their social environments (e.g., close friends, community, school, or work) were similar to them regarding race/ethnicity.




Figure 2: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within current residence shows across all categories of residence (except for Fraternity/Sorority housing), between 73%-83.4% of students reported 71%-100% of those on their social environments were similar to them regarding race/ethnicity. Less than 1% of students reported they live in a Fraternity or Sorority house. Responses from such a small number of participants cannot be considered reliable.




Figure 3: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within ethnicity shows 89% of FSU students who identified as Caucasian indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. However, among other ethnic groups, between 20% - 60% of FSU students indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. The data appear to suggest that there are notable differences in the social environments experienced prior to Ferris between Caucasian students and students of color.




Figure 4: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within religiosity shows across all three categories of religiosity, about 66% of students indicated 86% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 5: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within religious identification shows after collapsing 11 categories into Christians and non-Christians, about 84% of students that identified as Christians indicated 86% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. About 77% of students that identified as non-Christians indicated 86% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. Note that there is only a 7% difference between the two groups.




Figure 6: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within sexual orientation shows that regardless of sexual orientation and/or sexual identification, about 79%-80% of students reported 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 7: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within political/social ideology shows that regardless of political/social ideology, respondents indicated that 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 8: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within afford FSU without assistance shows that regardless of the need for assistance, about 79%-82% of students indicated that prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 9: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within the belief there are established procedures to address harassment shows of the 8.4% of students that reported they do not believe there are established procedures for addressing instances of harassment (those choosing 1-2), 68%-78% indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. Of the students indicating moderate confidence that there are established procedures (those choosing 3-5), 79%-84% indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. Of the students that indicated high confidence that there are established procedures (those choosing 6-7) 81%-86% indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 10: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within students' beliefs of harassment shows of the number of students that reported they did not felt harassed, 83% indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. Of the students that reported they felt harassed, 78% indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 11: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within predominant form of harassment shows across all categories (except for negative writings in Univ. publications) that about 43%-94% of those students who reported experiencing some form of harassment while attending FSU indicated prior to attending FSU 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity. Of the 354 students that responded to this question, 60.5% indicated they had received verbal comments.




Figure 12: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within reason of harassment shows that regardless of category, of those students reporting harassment, about 57%-100% indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.





Figure 13: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within source of harassment shows across all categories (except resident assistant and academic advisor), about 71%-86% of the students reporting harassment indicated that prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.




Figure 15: Experience with diversity prior to FSU regarding ethnicity within the college in which students are enrolled shows across all categories (except for the Michigan College of Optometry), about 64%-85% of students that reported they have enrolled in a certain college indicated prior to attending FSU, 71%-100% of those in their social environments were similar to them in ethnicity.
