¹EMU – A General Education Program Fee of \$16.75/cr. hr. is assessed on each 200 level course in Mathematics, Communications, English, and Science. Program fees are assessed for 300-499 course levels at the following rates: Education, Arts, Humanities, & Social Sciences = \$40.75/cr. hr. Science (Biol, Chem, Comp. Sci., Math, Phys. Astronomy), Business (all), and Technology, Health Sciences, HPHP, Social Work = \$46.5/cr. hr. Nursing = \$59/cr. hr. All other courses (not covered above) = \$32/cr.hr. for UG. Online course fees are \$62.00/cr.hr.for all online courses. There is a Student Teaching fee of \$175.00 per class.

²GVSU - An Additional \$20/cr. is assessed for International Studies, and Honors (course 200 level & above). An additional \$25/cr. is assessed for Art & Design, Music, School of Computing, Occupational Safety & Health, Radiologic & Imaging Science, Allied Health, Medical Lab Science, Therapeutic Recreation, and Speech & Language Patholoy (courses 200 level & above). These fees support higher program costs related to laboratory courses and equipment. The Program Fee is assessed on any student enrolled in a course with a chemistry course prefix (CHEM). Natural Science/Biology Program - A program fee of \$20 per credit hour is assessed on any student enrolled in a course with a natural science course prefix (BIOL, EVRN, GEOL, NSCI, & PHYS).

⁴MTU –Upper division undergraduate students not enrolled in engineering or computer science who are enrolled for 12 to 18 credits will be assessed, based on their major, a plateau differential tuition rate of \$7,827 or \$7,994 (resident) / \$16,567 or \$16,736 (non-resident) per semester. The graduate resident and non-resident per credit rate for Applied Science Education, Peace Corps, OSM/VISTA, and National Service Graduate Fellowship is \$688.00 for students enrolled in engineering or computer sciences, \$606.50 otherwise, and the Research Only mode tuition rate is \$339.00 for students enrolled in engineering or computer sciences, \$299.00 otherwise. All International students are charged an additional \$200.00 fee per semester. Online courses are charged an additional \$38.00 per credit. Newly admitted international graduate students will be assessed an additional, one-time, \$100 international graduate student surcharge at the start of their first semester.
