Instructional resources available to program instructors (MCL 388.1845 [6][b][vii])		FSU and KCAD on campus and off campus locations instructors are required to be in-serviced for the courses they intend to teach. The curriculum is reviewed, course outcomes are identified, training for writing course syllabi is offered, as well as review of assessment tools. Instructors are provided with a copy of the course syllabus, course outcomes, common assessments and instructor copies of texts where appropriate. This in-service is taught primarily by full-time FSU or KCAD faculty members. Syllabus and course curriculum are provided to all instructors teaching through KCAD off-campus locations. All instructors are required to submit their syllabi to FSU/KCAD each semester. Instructors have access to: MyFSU (Ferris State's online academic management platform), FSU email, Blackboard, FSU/KCAD library resources, FSU Faculty Center for Teaching and Learning resources and workshops and the Staff Center.		
Resources offered to the student in the program (MCL 388.1845 [6][b][viii])		On campus and off campus Students are eligible to receive Ferris/KCAD Student ID cards, have access to Ferris State's academic management platform (MyFSU), Ferris/KCAD Library resources, and Ferris State email, advising, tutoring, and writing support through the Academic Literacies Center, Supplemental Learning Assistance workshops when applicable, Educational Counseling and Disability Services, career services through CLACs, technology assistance, and computer labs.
