Welcome to the November-December newsletter! With the first few months of the academic school year behind you, many of you are, hopefully, finally settling into a rhythm.

On Oct. 19, we hosted our first Charter Schools Day event on the Ferris State University campus. We welcomed seven schools—Clara B. Ford Academy, Creative Technologies Academy, Hope Academy of West Michigan, Hope of Detroit Academy, Marshall Academy, Michigan Collegiate, and Voyageur Academy—for a full day of activities, including a football game, food, and academic presentations. Over 150 students and staff joined us, making it a memorable experience for all involved. If you were part of this day, the CSO and Ferris State University extend a heartfelt thank you!

We're pleased to announce that the redesigned Contract Performance Reports (CPRs) for each academy are now ready for review. We've scheduled visits to board meetings where we will present the CPRs and introduce board members and school leaders to our new support model. These visits will take place throughout November and December, so if you're a board member or school leader, expect to see the CSO team soon! On Nov. 5, we also held a Zoom meeting to share these changes with school leaders and representatives from various management companies. This month, we also began our new School Support Meeting process, led by our Associate Director, Margaret Baker. These meetings involve a deep dive into data across key pillars—Academic, Fiscal, Operations, and Compliance. Our goal is to leverage data and observations to identify areas where our schools might need additional support. Through these efforts, we aim to strengthen our partnerships with academies by focusing on areas of meaningful need. We'll keep all academy stakeholders informed as we progress.

We're excited about the year ahead and look forward to deepening our partnerships with academy boards and leaders to support their growth and success. Thank you for the opportunity to work with you!

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Competitive Grant Applications are Due on Nov. 15

All FSU-authorized academies are eligible to apply for a competitive grant of up to \$25,000 for the 2024-2025 academic year. The grant may be used for one of four "bucket" areas: Safety and Security, Extra Curricular Activities, Staff Professional Development, or Other projects that do not fit the first three areas. The total amount of funds for the grant program offered by the Ferris State University Charter Schools Office this year is \$400,000.

Applications are due to Epicenter no later than 5:00 p.m. on Nov. 15, 2024. Academies will be notified of their grant status no later than Nov. 29, 2024. Grant awards will be disbursed with Dec. 2024 state aid payments.

 - An interactive quadrant chart, which will allow you to visualize growth comparisons



Contract Performance Reports Have a New Academic Format

The CSO has been working hard to give the charts and graphs in the annual Contract Performance Reports (CPRs) a fresh look. Below is a guide to some of the changes that have been made.

- All academic contractual goals are posed as a question at the top of each corresponding chart.
- The contractual goals pertaining to the State Index Reports will always show the previous year's data + a minimum of a 3-year trend.
 - Due to MDE's release timeline, this data will always be a year behind all other data in the CPR. The CSO will take the progress trend into account when assigning Tier levels of support.
 - Once this score becomes available, the CSO will update the information in Epicenter to then evaluate if contractual goals were met.
- Subject area color coding:
 - Reading/ELA/EBRW will always be shown in orange
 - Math will always be shown in light blue
- A red line has been added to all of the graphs and charts to show where the contractual target is compared to the results of the academy.

- Circle graphs (affectionately referred to as "donuts") hold the direct answer to the question above it.
 - The outside of the circle depicts the subject area
 - The target is shown with a red line
 - The inside of the circle shows the results of the academy
- Results codes are similar to state and NWEA testing:
 - Dark Blue: Exceeds the contractual goal
 - Green: Meets the contractual goal
 - Yellow: Approaching the contractual goal
 - Red: Does Not Meet the contractual goal



Members of the CSO staff will be coming to board meetings over the next few months to share the results of each academy's CPR and explain the new format.


